Unit 11: SHORT ANSWERS

We can use short answers to answer (1) questions which ask for 'yes' or 'no' and (2) subject questions (Unit 10). The verb of a short answer contains only the first auxiliary (Unit 3).

With the verb be

QUESTION

Are they students?

Yes, they are.

Is he at home?

No, he is not.

Who was the winner?

John was.

With present and past simple (Units 19, 21)

QUESTION SHORT ANSWER

Does he drive a Mercedes? No, he doesn't.

Did John meet Maria at the airport? Yes, he **did**.

Who **gave** you all that money? My father **did**. NOT my father gave

Who **lives** in that house? John **does**. NOT *John lives*

NOTICE: Question: Does he drive a Mercedes?

CORRECT ANSWERS WRONG ANSWERS

Yes. Yes, he drives.

Yes, he does. Yes, he does drive.

Yes, he drives a Mercedes.

With other verb formations

QUESTION SHORT ANSWER

Are they having a party? Yes, they **are**.

Will Canada win the World Cup? No, they **won't**. (will not)

Have you been working hard? No, I haven't.

Who **has** got a light green car? John **has**.

NOTICE: We normally use the short form of **not** (\mathbf{n} 't) in short answers.
