Unit 15: USING THE VERB FORMS

Unit 14 tells you the names of the different forms and how to make them. This unit tells you when to use them.

1 Base form

a IN PRESENT TENSE (except for 3rd person singular)

EXAMPLES: We **live** near you.

Have you lived here long?

Do you live here?

b AFTER AUXILIARY VERB **DO** (Unit 17)

EXAMPLES: Did you live there?

c IN IMPERATIVES (Unit 18)

EXAMPLES: Have a seat!

d AFTER TO

EXAMPLES: I wanted **to go** home.

e AFTER MODAL VERBS (Unit 27)

EXAMPLES: You must hurry.

2 -s form

Use only in third person singular (Unit 2) of present tense.

EXAMPLES: He **lives** near you.

Has he lived here long? **Does** he live near you?

3 Past form

Use only in past tense.

EXAMPLES: They **lived** near us.

He **had** lived with them. **Did** you live there?

4 -ing form

a IN CONTINUOUS FORMATIONS (Units 22, 23, 24)

EXAMPLES: He is **living** with them.

She has been **swimming**.

b AS A NOUN (Unit 48.2)

EXAMPLES: Living here is very nice.

5 Past participle

a IN PERFECT FORMATIONS (Unit 24)

EXAMPLES: He has **lived** in many places.

b IN PASSIVE FORMATIONS (Unit 43)

EXAMPLES: Tea is **drunk** everywhere.

NOTICE: The forms of **be** and their uses are in Unit 16.
