## Unit 37: BE GOING TO

**Going to** is a way to talk about future time. We use the auxiliary verb **be** (Unit 16) before it and the base form (Unit 14) after it.

## 2 Use

a future intention John says he's going to be an engineer when he grows up.

(This is what he wants to be.)

**Are** you **going to watch** the movie this evening?

NOT will you

I'm going to speak to him about it.

(I have already decided to do this.)

BUT I'll speak to him about it. (I am deciding now.)

b prediction of the near future He's going to have an accident if he's not careful.

(He's driving very dangerously now.)

Oh dear! I think I'm going to be sick.

(I feel a little ill already.)

c future in the past I didn't know that you were going to become a policeman.

(I am surprised that you are a policeman.)

I was going to tell you the news, but I forgot.

(It was my intention to tell you.)
