Unit 53: NOUNS WITHOUT THE OR A

Sometimes we do not use **the** or **a / an / some / any** at the beginning of a noun phrase; we use nothing at all.

1 With names

With most names of people, places and times (Unit 48).

2 Talking generally

We all need water to live.	NOT	the water
Life is hard.	NOT	the life
Doctors cure sick people.	NOT	the doctors

BUT The water in this bottle is dirty. (Unit 52) He has had a good life. (Unit 54)

3 Identifying

With mass nouns:	It's coffee.
and plural nouns;	We are students.
BUT with singular nouns:	I am a student / It is a cup.

4 Talking about meals

He has breakfast at six.	NOT the breakfast
Why don't you stay for lunch?	NOT the lunch

5 Talking about illnesses

I think I've got **flu**. NOT *the* flu

6 After prepositions

When we are talking about:						
travelling	We went by bus.	NOT <i>the</i> bus				

some places	He was in b	ed.	NOT the bed	
	They went to school early.		NOT the school	
	She's in hospital with a broken leg.			
	Also with church, prison, university			
some times of day	at night	at midnight	at sunrise	
	BUT in the morning		in the afternoon	

BUT use **the** if you are saying which. We went by **the 7:45** bus. She's in **the hospital on Yonge Street.**
