
## Unit 78: IN A ROOM

This unit gives you examples of at, away from, behind, beside, between, by, in, in front of, near, next to, off, on and through when we are talking about things and people in a room.

## 1 Look at this seating plan of a classroom



John, Jim and Sue are on the left.

Sue, Pete and Liz are at the back.

Mary is in the middle.

John, Fred and Bill are at the front.

John is in front of Jim.

Jim is **behind** John.

Jim is **next to** (or **beside**) Mary.

Mary is **next to** (or **beside**) Jane.

Sue is **by** (or **next to**) the window.

John is **near** the door.

Mary is between Jim and Jane.


## 2 Use on and off for surfaces



There were dirty marks on the ceiling.



The teacher wiped the writing **off** the blackboard.



## 3

I could see the TV **through** the window. (I was outside.)

It was so cold there was ice **on** the window. (a surface)

I could see the trees reflected **in** the window. (The window was like a mirror.)

Get **away from** the window! (Don't stay near the window; there is danger

outside it.)

**NOTICE** Suddenly, the teacher walked **in.** into the room

The teacher was so angry, he walked **out.** out of the room
